Case Management Checklist: TVAP vs. PRS

TVAP and PRS case managers should discuss division of responsibilities and areas of support based on their location, rapport with the family, and familiarity with local resources. Each case will look different.

TVAP and PRS case managers should also discuss their distinct roles with the minor/family and get the minor's consent to share information and coordinate services.

Legal Services	 Connect to specialized legal services if the minor is pursuing a T visa Coordinate with law enforcement if pursuing Continued Presence 	 Provide information about attending court Ensure minor has needed documents from ORR Connect to low-cost legal resources
Safety & Placement Stability	 Assess for signs of trafficking or exploitation by the sponsor Safety plan with the minor around possible re-trafficking concerns Notify USCRI with placement stability/safety concerns 	 Assess for safety and stability of placement Report child abuse/neglect to CPS and notify ORR with concerns Discuss indicators of trafficking or other safety concerns with TVAP provider and coordinate on safety planning
Education	 Address any barriers to the minor attending school Support with Federal Student Aid and specialized education options 	 Ensure the minor is enrolled in school and address any barriers Request any needed documentation from ORR Provide post-18 resources
