ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS



A child with a Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Interim Assistance Letter, an HHS Eligibility Letter, or a pending referral to the HHS Office of Trafficking in Persons (OTIP) and has emergency needs is eligible for a variety of services through the Aspire Child & Youth Services Program.

CASE MANAGEMENT



USCRI connects children and their families with an organization that will help them access important social services. Each child is assigned a case manager to work with the child and family. All case management services are free and confidential.

The case manager will help:

- ✓ Find an immigration attorney
- ✓ Locate a medical professional
- ✓ Obtain a non-work social security card
- ✓ Apply for public benefits

CLIENT ASSISTANCE



Once connected to a social services organization, the case manager assists with:

ELIGIBILITY TIMELINE



Aspire case management can be accessed before a child's 18th birthday with the HHS Interim Assistance Letter or the HHS Eligibility Letter. Of note, an individual who received an HHS Eligibility Letter as a child may receive assistance as an adult through USCRI's TVAP program with their HHS Eligibility Letter.
